Biography:

St. John's Evangelical Church was located at 13th and New Hampshire Streets in Lincoln, Nebraska's North Bottoms. It was organized by a group of German Russians in 1907. It belonged to the Evangelical Synod of North America until becoming independent in 1926. In 1946, it joined the German Congregational Association of Nebraska. When the United Church of Christ formed in the 1960s, St. John's became a member of that organization. In 1967, St. John's merged with Salem United to form Faith United Church of Christ. The combined church occupies the old Salem Church building at 9th and Charleston also in the North Bottoms. The St. John's property was sold.

Scope and Content:

This collection consists of the record register book from 1907-1964 with birth, baptism, confirmation, marriage, death dates; communion record book, 1928-1967 and a scrapbook that includes issues of The Friendly Visitor (published by St. John's Evangelical Church, Lincoln, Neb.), 1944-1945 and church programs.
