Volunteer translators or donations are needed to accelerate the translation of records held by AHSGR!

AHSGR has purchased a number of deportation lists from the Black Sea area and will post them on the AHSGR website for members to view. These list cover numerous villages and are some of the first to be translated into English from Russian/Ukrainian. The records will be posted for viewing as they become available to AHSGR.

Last year, two excerpts from the Aussiedler Collection were completed. These excerpts contain a translated voice over recording, making these priceless recordings available to the English-speaking audience. Our goal is to complete this process for the entire 60 hours of recordings in the Aussiedler Collection. Volunteer help is needed. Individuals interested in assisting with translation of tapes or doing voice recordings may contact this committee. Knowledge of the German language is required to assist with translations.

Treffen Tuesday continues to be a successful program for members as well as non-members. Attendance is generally between 100 – 200 attendees. This program is held the last Tuesday of each month, except for the convention month, November and December. All 2025 presentations are scheduled and 2026 speakers are currently being scheduled. ## **Convention Committee**

The 54<sup>th</sup> Annual AHSGR International Convention was held August 7-9, 2024 in Oklahoma City, Oklahoma and had 218 attendees. The Central Oklahoma and North Texas Chapters joined forces to co-host the convention and provided a large team of enthusiastic volunteers. The convention program covered topics representing our diverse settlement areas in Russia as well as the unique experience of the Germans from Russia in Oklahoma and Texas. From the keynote speaker, Dr. Michael Brown, to the banquet speaker, Dr. Brent Mai, the presentations and speakers were consistently of high quality, contained new information and were well attended.

The 55th Annual AHSGR International Convention will be held in Lincoln, Nebraska at the Embassy Suites Hotel on July 30 through August 1, 2025.

- Expanded program covering three full days
- Program is structured to focus on our Germans from Russia history, heritage and experience in Germany, Russia and the Americas.
- Single track program so that attendees can attend all sessions.
- Speakers have been selected from across the globe to provide new information that has not been shared at past conventions.
- AHSGR Heritage Center will be open throughout the convention so that attendees can visit our museum and research library.

#### **Future Conventions**

The 56<sup>th</sup> Annual AHSGR International Convention will be held in Hays, Kansas on August 5-7, 2026. The convention is being held in conjunction with the 150<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the first Volga German settlers arriving in Ellis County, Kansas.

The 57<sup>th</sup> Annual AHSGR International Convention will be held in Lincoln, Nebraska on July 28-30, 2027.



## **Culture and Folklore Committee**

The Folklore Committee continues to focus on three activities: the AHSGR Storytelling Contest, AHSGR Book Club, and recipes.

#### **Storytelling Contest**

Storytelling is an important oral and written tradition that ensures that the Germans from Russia history and heritage is captured and passed on to future generations.

The 2024 Storytelling Contest winners were announced in a virtual Zoom session on October 10, 2024. This was a change from past years where the Storytelling Contest winners were announced at the annual convention. This change was made to encourage story submissions and reach a larger audience.

The 2025 Storytelling Contest Zoom event will be November 25, 2025 as part of the Treffen Tuesday presentation series.

- Submissions can be fiction or non-fiction stories as well as poetry.
- Submission deadline is September 12.
- The Storytelling Contest is open to AHSGR members and non-members. Youth (under age 15) are also encouraged to participate.
- Prizes will be:

Short Story Category: \$250 first place, \$150, second place, \$100, third place. Poetry Category: \$250 first place, \$150, second place, \$100, third place.

The AHSGR Writer's Group is available for anyone wanting to connect with other writers, explore writing ideas, and ask questions about writing stories, poems, and articles about their families. The Writer's Group is held virtually via Zoom.

#### **Book Club**

The quarterly AHSGR Book Club focuses on the stories and history in books about the German from Russia experience. The Book Club is open to members and non-members and is held virtually via Zoom. In the past-year the following books were explored:

## **Finance and Investment Committee**

During this year, the Finance Committee reviewed 2024 actual budget performance against the approved 2024 budget plan and established a 2025 operating budget. The committee, with the designated members of the Investment Committee, reviewed the investment plan and began the active management of the Society investments under advice of Charles Schwab Corporation (Schwab).

With the passing of Jerry Siebert, it became necessary to engage professional investment management capabilities. The committee met (October 1, 2024) with Schwab financial advisors to review the current investment strategy and decided to continue to maintain the funds in Schwab and rely on their investment advice. On October 13, 2024, the Investment Committee met with our Schwab advisors and provided an overview of the portfolio and purpose of the respective accounts. Subsequently, the Investment Committee reviewed Schwab's proposed investment strategy and approved the new plan to diversify the industry segmentation and to remain neutral between growth and stable assets. These changes were approved and implemented on December 5, 2024.

The Investment Committee met on January 22, 2025 and reviewed the initial performance and made minor adjustments based on Schwab recommendations. The Investment Committee met on April 2, 2025, and reviewed Q1 performance and approved further diversification and rebalancing of asset categories. The Investment Committee will continue to meet with Schwab on a quarterly basis to review investment performance.

The Finance Committee held a budget work session on October 2, 2024. The goal was to simplify the budget and rely on the general ledger (*QuickBooks*) to establish the 2025 operating budget and standard monthly and quarterly financial reports. The Board of Directors approved the 2025 Budget Plan at the 2024 Fall Board of Directors meeting. The 2024 full-year budget actuals were in line with the budget plan with notably less reliance on reserve funds than in 2023. Thus far in 2025, expenditures are in line with the approved budget plan. The Finance Committee will continue to monitor budget performance on a quarterly basis.



# **Fundraising Committee**

Financial donations are critical to support the ongoing operations of AHSGR as well as targeted special projects such as the acquisition of records, translations, digitization, technology equipment, facility maintenance projects and improvements.

Multiple fundraising strategies are utilized by AHSGR:

- Winter and Spring Fundraising Drives, Give to Lincoln Day
- Targeted Fundraising Drives for specific needs
- Recurring Donations (e.g., monthly giving)
- Employee Matching Gift Programs
- Planned Giving such as bequests, endowments, gifts, IRA qualified charitable distributions, etc.
- Corporate Giving from organizations who have connections with the Germans from Russia
- Grants

The Fundraising Committee met on October 10, December 10, 2024 and February 11, 2025, to review various donor categories and ideas for potential outreach. The 2024 fundraising target of \$215,000 was exceeded due to several unexpected bequests from estates.

The committee has targeted several external foundations with connections to German from Russia individuals and corporations.



# **Genealogy Research Committee**

The mission of the Genealogy Research Committee is to develop and implement genealogical research tools and services to explore the genealogical legacy of the German Settlers in the Russian Empire. This includes both online and in-person resources for both new and experienced genealogical researchers.

The Genealogy Research Committee has focused on the following projects over the past year.

German Origins Project

- This existing German Origins data on the AHSGR website is being reviewed, updated and converted to a database-compatible format. This has been a major project that was initiated two years ago and is nearing completion.
- The Board of Directors has approved funding to create a new German Origins database and web-based interface. This new database will be searchable by settlement village in Russia and surname. Users will be able to submit new German Origins information for inclusion in this database.

#### **Village Coordinator Program**

The subset of active Village Coordinators is being confirmed. Village Coordinators who
are not responsive or no longer active are being removed from the program. Our goal
is to have an accurate, up-to-date list of highly engaged, responsive Village
Coordinators.

#### **Enhanced Web-based Tools**

• Work is ongoing to develop an web-based interactive timeline that summarizes key milestones in the history of the Germans from Russia.

#### **Digitization**

• A high priority area of focus is digitization of AHSGR's collection to support on-line access. The Genealogy Research Committee works closely with AHSGR staff to define digitization priorities.



### **Supporting the Germans from Russia Community**

Genealogical records related to the Germans from Russia are held by AHSGR as well as
other organizations and individuals. AHSGR is actively engaging with other parties to
help ensure information is not lost with passing time. AHSGR technology platforms are
available to provide storage and maintenance of genealogical records. Interested
parties are encouraged to discuss with AHSGR.

## **Research Requests**

• AHSGR staff at the Heritage Center responded to 414 research requests in 2024 and continues this pace through the first half of 2025.




# **Marketing and Public Affairs Committee**

# **Strategic Planning Committee**

## **Partnering/Outreach**

The committee continues its focus on strategies to strengthen partnerships in the Germans from Russia community and build relationships with key academic institutions. Outreach to the Max Kade Institute for German American Studies at the University of Wisconsin explored possible greater collaboration and joining the American Historical Association as an affiliated society. The committee received a report on the Society's relationship with Canadian chapters and other Germans from Russia related organizations.

### **Funding Priorities**

The committee developed a survey to gain input from Board Directors and staff regarding the priorities among the various competing demands for resources including:

- Implementation of a Digital Asset Management system to increase digital access to our collection and provide tools to create group-defined access.
- Update the aging Heritage Center facility in Lincoln, Nebraska to improve functionality and visitor experience
- Ongoing operations to support membership, programs, publications and collections.

AHSGR cannot afford to do everything it wants to do. We need to think carefully about where we focus our efforts to maximize our impact to the Germans from Russia interest community and strengthen the long-term viability of AHSGR. In the coming months, the Board of Directors will define this direction for AHSGR.

#### Other

- Pursuing actions to increase the academic profile of AHSGR. This includes bringing the *AHSGR Journal* into alignment with Scopus Indexed Journals.
- In February, the committee met with Cary Bright and discussed her experience working with commercial genealogy research organizations and how to raise the profile of the Germans from Russia ancestral groups.
- The committee evaluated feedback from participation in the 2025 RootsTech conference.
